ZAVTRA.UA, UKRAINE'S LARGEST PRIVATE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Since 2006, the Victor Pinchuk Foundation has been investing in a new generation that will build a new Ukraine. The Zavtra.UA scholarship program selects students who combine academic excellence with leadership and social activism.

Having provided more than 2700 stipends over 12 years, Zavtra.UA is Ukraine's largest private scholarship program. Students receive a monthly stipend and unique opportunities for developing skills, networking and exchanging experience.

The foundation supports them in implementing their social projects to change Ukraine. In addition, grantees regularly attend lectures by world leaders in Kyiv. Tony Blair, Bill Clinton, Shimon Peres and Condoleezza Rice, among others, have spoken to the Zavtra.UA community. Select alumni are also invited to the Young Leaders Section at the Yalta European Strategy (YES) Annual Meetings, where they meet with global thinkers and political leaders to discuss challenges facing Ukraine and the world.

WORLDWIDESTUDIES: SHAPING UKRAINE'S FUTURE THROUGH EDUCATION

To create a new Ukraine, leaders must have a world-class education. Since 2010, the WorldWideStudies (WWS) has been giving Ukraine's most promising students and young professionals access to the world's best 200 universities. In exchange, they commit to return to Ukraine and apply their newly acquired knowledge and skills for the benefit of their country for at least five years.

Scholarships are awarded in spheres important to Ukraine's development, such

as public administration, public law, ecology, agriculture, aerospace engineering and alternative energy. Grants cover up to 60% of the total cost of a Master's program.

The community of WWS scholarship holders is a driver of change in Ukraine. WWS alumni are active in many fields, and their community is a network of smart, proactive, enthusiastic and enterprising individuals who are transforming Ukraine today.

Young Ukrainians discuss the challenges facing Ukraine and the world with some of the leading minds of our time. These conversations help the next generation to ask new questions and broaden their worldview.

In 2018, among others, Keith Alexander, Director of the National Security Agency

(2005-2014); Pulitzer Prize winner Anne Applebaum; Jigsaw CEO Jared Cohen, and Professor of Stanford and Harvard Universities Niall Ferguson gave lectures and spoke to Ukrainian students in Kyiv.

Previous speakers have included Tony Blair, David Cameron, Bill Clinton, Michio Kaku, John Kerry, Shimon Peres, Condoleezza Rice, Jimmy Wales and Muhammad Yunus.

VETERAN HUB


The Veteran Hub is the first open space in Ukraine specifically dedicated to war veterans and NGOs dealing with veteran affairs. The Hub combines an administrative centre that provides social, psychological and legal support with an educational platform for events for veterans, their families and society in general. It was opened in partnership with the Victor Pinchuk Foundation, Olena Pinchuk Foundation and Pobratymy NGO in Kyiv in 2018.

Providing centralized services to war veterans, security sector employees (police and rescue workers), their relatives and loved ones,

members of military families and families of missing persons, and victims of war, Veteran Hub also offers support for their reintegration into society.

The Veteran Hub has continued its strategy of preserving the lives and health of men and women serving in the military and volunteer organizations, developed in 2014-2015 under the Medsanbat project by Victor and Olena Pinchuk. This project aimed at training military doctors in NATO standards and developing Ukrainian standards for tactical medicine.

ABOUT PINCHUKARTCENTRE

The PinchukArtCentre was founded in September 2006 by businessman and philanthropist Victor Pinchuk. It is one of the largest and most dynamic private contemporary art centres in Central and Eastern Europe. With over 3 million visitors, the PinchukArtCentre has become an international hub for contemporary art, developing the Ukrainian art scene while generating critical public discourse for society as a whole.

For more than a decade, the PinchukArtCentre has provided free access to new ideas, perceptions and emotions. Its exhibition program investigates national identity in the context of international challenges. It engages the public in a dynamic dialogue through a full range of educational and discursive events.

A year ahead of the presidential and parliamentary elections in Ukraine, the exhibition provoked more than 200,000 visitors with critical questions about our democratic model, its failures, challenges and the threats it faces.

Together with an engaging public program of lectures, talks and films, it made the PinchukArtCentre a hotspot for critical reflection on the political realities of our time.

The exhibition included works from, among others, Francis Alÿs, Allora & Calzadilla, Maurizio Cattelan, Olafur Eliasson, Damien Hirst, Takashi Murakami and Luc Tuymans.

INVESTING IN UKRAINIAN HISTORY

The PinchukArtCentre's **Research Platform on Ukrainian art** is building a future for Ukraine by mapping and understanding Ukrainian art history. This is resulting in the creation of a living archive of Ukrainian art and a first book, published in 2018: "**Parcommune: Place, Community, Phenomenon.**"

Alongside systematic articles and discussions, we created an active and engaging discourse through two exhibitions that drew upon our research while revitalizing and reevaluating Ukrainian art.

"**A Space of One's Own**", on the place of women in 20th century Ukrainian art, responded to the Ukrainian masculine dominated art world, where the position of women and their importance has long been neglected. The second exhibition "**Red Book: Soviet Art in Lviv in the 80s and 90s**" was the first large study exploring artistic life of the 80s and 90s in Lviv and its relation to Soviet art.

INVESTING IN UKRAINIAN FUTURE

In 2018, we presented the fifth edition of the **PinchukArtCentre Prize** and celebrated 10 years of its existence.

20 artists were selected out of 650 applications and the shortlist was exhibited in PinchukArtCentre, with almost 90.000 people visiting the exhibition.

The winner, **Anna Zvyagentseva**, received \$10,000 and was automatically shortlisted for the Future Generation Art Prize 2019.

Two special prize winners, **Mykola Karabinovych** and the group **Yarema Malashchuk and Roman Himey** each received production support.

The prizes were awarded in Kyiv by an international jury consisting of Björn Geldhof, artistic director of the PinchukArtCentre; Zhanna Kadyrova, artist; Alicia Knock, curator of the Center Pompidou; Viktor Misiano, curator, editor-in-chief of the edition "Artistic magazine" and Daniel Muzyczuk, curator of the Muzeum Sztuki.

CRADLES OF HOPE

CRADLES OF HOPE

Since 2006, the Victor Pinchuk Foundation has created 34 cutting edge neonatal centers throughout Ukraine to save the lives of premature babies. The Cradles of Hope program is building this network of neonatal centers in existing state hospitals. The program provides high-tech medical equipment, training for doctors and nurses, IT networks and technical support.

In 2018, the Foundation opened a new Cradles of Hope center in Lviv and held its

Annual Neonatal Conference, where leading international specialists in neonatology from the USA, Norway, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, and Austria shared their expertise with 150 neonatologists from all over Ukraine.

Since the program's launch, 34 centers have been equipped and 1,475 healthcare professionals from all regions of Ukraine have been trained. 47,441 infants have been saved thanks to the program.

UKRAINIAN PHILANTHROPIC MARKETPLACE

The Victor Pinchuk Foundation created and supports the first and biggest philanthropic online fundraising platform in Ukraine, the Ukrainian Philanthropic Marketplace (UBB, ubb.org.ua).

By December 2018, over 198 million hryvnias had been raised on UBB to save lives and support philanthropic projects in numerous areas. More than 3,800 projects by 120 accredited NGOs have been supported via UBB.

UBB allows for transparent, accountable and convenient giving to thoroughly vetted NGOs

and individual projects. It helps change the landscape of charity in Ukraine, where historic mistrust and the fear of fraud have prevented many from giving support beyond their family and circle of friends.

UBB has received various national awards, such as the “Best Ukrainian/International Charity Fund” in 2013-2018, as well as the “Innovations in Charity Award-2014”. In 2016, it was recognized as the “Most Effective and Helpful Philanthropic Project in Ukraine.” In 2018, UBB was celebrated as the “Most Transparent and Public Philanthropic Organization in Ukraine.”

BABYN YAR HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL CENTER



"It is extremely important for us to fulfill our moral duty to those who perished, who survived, and who risked their lives to help. BABYN YAR HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL CENTER

The Victor Pinchuk Foundation supports the Babyn Yar Holocaust Memorial Center (BYHMC), a non-profit educational institution with a mission to document and commemorate the Holocaust and in particular, the Babyn Yar mass shootings of September 1941. Thus, the Center contributes to the creation of a more resilient and democratic society and to the peaceful coexistence of future generations.

The BYHMC is slated to become the largest Holocaust memorial center in Eastern Europe and the first major complex on the territory of the former Soviet Union.

On September 29, 2016, the BYHMC commemorated the 75th anniversary of the shooting execution of 33,771 Jews in just two days at Babyn Yar, one of the most notorious atrocities of World War II. On this day, the Initiative Group of the BYHMC signed a Declaration of Intent to create a memorial center.

In 2018, an international design competition for the Center was launched. BYHMC's ambition is to become a national and international benchmark project that brings the landscape and memorial park in synergy with iconic architecture and a unique visiting experience

JEWISH COMMUNITIES AND SUPPORT FOR AWARENESS OF THE HOLOCAUST

For more than 12 years, the Victor Pinchuk Foundation has supported Ukraine's Jewish community and contributed to sustainable interethnic understanding in Ukraine and to nationwide comprehension of the Holocaust tragedy.

For his contribution to bringing Jewish and non-Jewish Ukrainians closer together and for his support for Jewish communities in Ukraine, Victor Pinchuk received the Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky Award in 2014.

In 2006, a documentary about the Holocaust in Ukraine, "Spell Your Name", was co-produced by Steven Spielberg and Victor Pinchuk with the USC Shoah Foundation Institute. Over the past 12 years, the Foundation has supported, among others, the Joseph and Fanny Tsindlikht private pre-school in Dnipro and the Yad Vashem International School for Holocaust Studies, an event organized by the Jewish Confederation of Ukraine to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the Babyn Yar tragedy, and the exhibition "Holocaust by Bullets" about the mass shootings of Jews by German soldiers, that was shown in several Ukrainian cities.

TONY BLAIR INSTITUTE FOR GLOBAL CHANGE

The Tony Blair Institute for Global Change (TBI), an international partner of the Victor Pinchuk Foundation, aims to help make globalisation work for the many by addressing some of the most difficult challenges in the world today.

Its Renewing the Centre program seeks to revitalise the centre ground of Western politics by building practical policy solutions to address these challenges and help equip today's leaders to combat the rising tide of populism. Technology is at the forefront of the way the world is changing around us and TBI has set out a series of comprehensive proposals for how governments can harness

the benefits for the public good while mitigating the risks. Tony Blair has spoken in various forums on these issues, including the Web Summit and the Yalta European Strategy (YES) Annual Meeting in Ukraine.

Since its inception in Ukraine, over 13,000 students in around 230 schools have benefitted from the innovative Generation Global program by learning the essentials of dialogue in the classroom. Around 4400 students also participated in 870 global video conferences TBI facilitated with other students around the world and it have trained over 700 teachers on the pedagogy of dialogue.

UKRAINE ELECTIONS TASK FORCE

UKRAINE ELECTIONS TASK FORCE

In September 2018, the Atlantic Council, the Victor Pinchuk Foundation and the Transatlantic Commission on Election Integrity launched the Ukrainian Election Task Force (UETF) to track and expose foreign interference in the Ukrainian Presidential elections in March 2019.

Working with other Ukrainian institutions – Detektor Media, the Razumkov Center and StopFake – the three partners created a rapid-response team with the ability to monitor, evaluate and disclose the full range of foreign subversive activities in Ukraine and to propose suitable responses.

To raise awareness of the issue in Ukraine and in the West, UETF launched an online dashboard providing a real-time index of efforts to interfere in Ukraine’s democratic process.

By exposing foreign interference, UETF provided Ukrainians with tools to check outside efforts to influence their vote, to establish the facts, and to cast their ballots for a better future for Ukraine.

YALTA EUROPEAN STRATEGY

Yalta European Strategy (YES) is a leading forum for discussing Ukraine's European future and global context. It is governed by an international supervisory board: Aleksander Kwaśniewski (Chairman), Carl Bildt, Pat Cox, Wolfgang Ischinger, Stéphane Fouks, Victor Pinchuk (founder), and Anders Fogh Rasmussen.

Since 2004, YES has organized high-level international meetings and events in Ukraine and the EU. Its Yalta Annual Meetings are the major international forum in Ukraine to discuss global challenges and the future of Ukraine in Europe. The 15th YES Annual Meeting, "The Next Generation of Everything" took place on September 13-15, 2018, in Kyiv.

The Forum addressed the issues that will be shaping our world in the next 10 years and beyond - from automation, artificial intelligence and blockchain technology to strategic challenges in geopolitics, security and global trade.

Among the speakers were: Tony Blair, former Prime Minister of the United Kingdom and Executive Chairman of the Tony Blair Institute; Bono, U2 frontman; Niall Ferguson, Senior Research Fellow at the Hoover Institution of Stanford University; Richard Haass, President of the Council on Foreign Relations; Kersti Kaljulaid, President of Estonia; Ray Kurzweil, inventor, author, futurist; Condoleezza Rice, 66th U.S. Secretary of State; Larry Summers, Harvard University Professor.

Over 100 representatives of regional executive authorities, regional council members and civic activists as well as over 105 students and young leaders from every region of Ukraine participated in the Ukrainian Regional Civil Servants and Young Leaders Sections at the 15th YES Annual Meeting to learn from world leaders and to develop their professional networks. This was yet another contribution by YES towards integrating Ukraine with world while helping young Ukrainians to build a new Ukraine.

Furthermore, at the 15th YES Annual Meeting the PinchukArtCentre presented contemporary art works, including "Wave UFO" by Mariko Mori as a symbol for the future, a fragment from the large painting by Olafur Eliasson "Whenever the rainbow appears", which was used as the main visual element for the YES Dining Hall, and an exclusive collaboration with Takashi Murakami, who created a painting titled "Ukraine: War & Peace" (ウクライナ:戦争と平和), a diptych depicting flowers and skulls on the colors of the Ukrainian state flag.

DAVOS UKRAINIAN BREAKFAST

To foster transformation in Ukraine and put Ukraine on the international agenda, the Victor Pinchuk Foundation organizes the Davos Ukrainian Breakfast during the Annual Meeting of the World Economic Forum. Each year since 2005, the event has brought together Ukrainian and international leaders.

In 2018, the speakers discussed where Ukraine was heading under the new political reality in the world and how international partners could support Ukraine in its struggle for territorial integrity, freedom and the goal to build up a country founded on European values.

The event featured a keynote speech by the Petro Poroshenko, President of Ukraine, (2014-2019). Fareed Zakaria, host of Zakaria GPS on CNN, moderated the discussion with Chrystia Freeland, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Canada, David Lipton, First Deputy Managing Director of IMF, Aleksander Kwaśniewski, President of Poland (1995-2005), Anders Fogh Rasmussen, Secretary General of NATO (2009-2014), Prime Minister of Denmark (2001-2009), and Wolfgang Ischinger, Chairman of the Munich Security Conference.

Previous speakers have included José Manuel Barroso, Sir Richard Branson, David Cameron, Thomas Friedman, Robert Gates George Soros, and others.

UKRAINE HOUSE DAVOS

In 2017, the Victor Pinchuk Foundation co-founded the first-ever Ukraine House Davos during the 48th Annual Meeting of the World Economic Forum (WEF) with the aim of highlighting the vibrant, energetic European country and society that is Ukraine. This idea was supported by artworks of the young Ukrainian artist Anna Zvyagintseva that were exhibited at the venue by the PinchukArtCentre. Under the theme Ukraine: Creativity, Innovation, Opportunity, this multi-format space showcased investment opportunities in Ukraine's IT and Innovation sector to global business, technology and investment leaders. The Ukraine House became a center of communication, hospitality and networking opportunities, with

over 5000 guests attending dynamic global panels and presentations.

Featured speakers included president of the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development Sir Suma Chakrabarti; former world heavyweight boxing champions Vitaliy and Volodymyr Klitschko; President of Ukraine Petro Poroshenko (2014-2019), and chief humanoid at SingularityNet Sophia the Robot.

The initiative was implemented in association with the Western NIS Enterprise Fund and Ukrainian Venture Capital and Private Equity Association.

THE UKRAINIAN LUNCH IN MUNICH

Since 2017, the Victor Pinchuk Foundation has been hosting The Ukrainian Lunch in Munich during the Munich Security Conference to promote Ukraine on the global security agenda and underline Ukraine's importance for Europe's security and the international order. Political and opinion leaders and professionals from around the world gather to debate today's security challenges and strategies.

In 2018, the panel discussion "Ukraine on the Frontlines of a New Kind of Warfare: Lessons for the West, and Prospects for Peace" was focused on possible scenarios to enhance

Ukraine's security and the issue of possible alternatives to the Minsk agreements on a settlement for the Donbass conflict.

The event brought together Petro Poroshenko, President of Ukraine (2014-2019), Chrystia Freeland, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Canada, Dr. Robert Gates, 22nd U.S. Secretary of Defense (2006-2011), Pavlo Klimkin, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine (2014-2019), Kurt Volker, United States Special Representative for Ukraine Negotiations (2017-2019), and others. Stephen Sackur, Presenter, HARDtalk, BBC World News, moderated the discussion.

SECURITY ROUNDTABLE

SECURITY ROUNDTABLE

Starting from 2017, the Victor Pinchuk Foundation has held roundtables on Ukraine's national security to bring the best minds to Ukraine to discuss critical issues and develop solutions, thereby improving understanding and decision-making. The high-level Ukrainian and international security experts as well as practitioners examine a range of security topics with the widest strategic reach. Accompanying public events draw Ukraine's young generation into the discussion.





ORGANIZATIONAL AND FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS



The Victor Pinchuk Foundation was established in 2006, bringing together the various lines of philanthropic activities Victor Pinchuk had been developing over the previous 12 years. The Victor Pinchuk Foundation combines two legal entities: one not-for-profit UK entity, "The UK Office of the Victor Pinchuk Foundation", which serves as the international representative office and facilitates the Foundation's international activities, and one charity not-for-profit organization registered under Ukrainian charitable law (Ukrainian Charitable Organisation "Foundation of Victor Pinchuk – Social Initiative", which covers various activities in Ukraine.

All the activities of the above foundations, hereinafter collectively referred to as "The Victor Pinchuk Foundation", are governed by one management team. Reporting to the

founder on an annual basis, management prepares a combined statement of cash receipts and disbursements, which presents the cash receipts and disbursements of these two foundations, together with a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information ("the Combined Statement"). The Combined Statement for 2018, audited by Ernst & Young Audit Services LLC, was issued on 22 May 2019. A full set of the Combined Statement together with Independent Auditors' Report can be obtained at request from the Victor Pinchuk Foundation.

The Foundations receive donations primarily from legal entities for the purpose of funding various charitable and social projects and making charitable donations.
